 wildlife spotting on open decks.
- Signature Expeditions: Kayak alongside icebergs or cruise by Zodiac, launching right from the yacht's Marina platform. Expedition Guides enrich the journey with storytelling, lectures, and guided hikes.
- Denali Extensions: Optional Cruise Tours pair Alaska's coastline with inland journeys to Denali National Park.
- Japan with Windstar Flair: Guests sail from iconic ports like Tokyo, Hiroshima, and Kyoto to smaller harbors such as Karatsu and Takamatsu, where udon-making workshops and tea ceremonies await.
- Exclusive Destination Discovery Event: In Tomonoura, Windstar guests explore Edoperiod streets with exclusive access to cultural treasures—live koto music, samurai sword performances, tea ceremonies, calligraphy workshops, and private entry into historic residences.
- Windstar Mystery Cruise Now in Asia: Adventurers can embark in Hokkaido and disembark in Osaka, with each port revealed only days in advance. Featuring new-to-Windstar South Korean ports, the Mystery Cruise pairs seamlessly with Grand Japan for a 21-day voyage.
